

PTA NEWS

The school year is winding down and it's a good time to reflect on what we've accomplished this past year. We planned two very successful fundraisers – Carnival/Auction in the fall and the Color Run this spring. Our fundraisers allow us to raise money to support the school without having to send our young children door-to-door for catalog sales and at the same time function as events that bring us together as a community!

Our big project this year was to provide laptop backpacks for the school to use on field trips. Our students generally take electronic equipment with them on outings, as well as classwork, pens/pencils, and a sack lunch. It can be a lot for students and chaperones to keep up with. Using these new backpacks, students will be able to carry everything they need, the electronics are stored in a protective pocket inside, and they are easily identifiable with the Beaver Tech logo and contact information on the back.

We bring educational programs to the students and parents at Beaver Tech. This year we covered the expense for The Morris Brothers to come speak to the students about bullying and the Mavs Man and his sidekick Champ to come out for Jam the Gym to talk about healthy eating and healthy, active lifestyles.

We allocated fifty dollars per teacher to help purchase needed resources and classroom materials that they would not otherwise be able to purchase through the district's Vendor Program. This is the second year we've offered this to teachers at Beaver Tech and each year many teachers take advantage of this money to buy needed supplies for their classrooms.

The PTA supports the Character and Leadership program with spirit sticks that students are able to earn when they exhibit these behaviors. We also provide the Toys R Us gift cards that are awarded in the drawing at the end of each semester. This program rewards and reinforces model behavior in students at Beaver Tech!

If you've been to Beaver recently, you may have noticed that the "game room" is now located on the stage in the cafeteria. The PTA covered the expense of overhauling the game room at Beaver Tech with two new flat screen TVs, gently used game consoles and games. Beaver Tech uses the game room to reward students for meeting their goals.

These are just the highlights. There's so much more that we do. The PTA's mission is to make every child's potential a reality and I think we are doing just that at Beaver Tech. When you start with great teachers and staff and combine that with great volunteers, together we're able to help provide and support amazing educational experiences for our children that they would not be able to receive at any other school in this district.

	President	Presides at all meetings of the association, attends committee meetings, attends GISD Council meetings, coordinates the work of the officers and chairman committees of the association, and proof all documents before distribution
	1 st VP – Membership	Encourages parents, staff and community members to join PTA throughout the school year, plans a membership table to be present at all PTA and school functions, maintains an accurate membership roster at all times, submits dues to Texas PTA, distribute membership cards to all members.
	2 nd VP – Fundraising	Coordinates fundraisers, actively promotes and coordinates all shopping rebate programs, coordinates the annual school supply sale, coordinates school restaurant nights.
	3 rd VP – Communications	Compiles, prints and distributes the monthly newsletter, coordinates and distributes publicity on PTA events, provides date information to publish on school and PTA websites and the campus marquee.
	Secretary	Records the minutes of all meetings of the association, maintains, sends meeting reminders to board members, and distributes an accurate board directory.
	Treasurer	Keeps accurate and complete accounts of money received and spent, makes disbursements and deposits, presents a financial report at every meeting, presents a proposed budget to the association, files all tax documents, reconciles bank statements monthly.
	Parliamentarian	Willing to learn about parliamentary procedure; will become familiar with our bylaws and Robert's Rules of Order; updates bylaws as amendments are made; advises President on questions of parliamentary law when needed.

	Arts in Education	Promote the Arts in Education program. Coordinate and encourage student participation in the Reflections program and 5 th Grade Greeting Card contest.
	Auction	Coordinate with the Carnival Chairman the organizing, soliciting for, and set-up of the annual auction to be held in conjunction with the school carnival.
	Bilingual Liaison	Serve as representative of the bilingual families at the school, work with teachers and the Volunteer Coordinator to recruit bilingual volunteers, coordinate with the Room Representative for the bilingual room parent orientation, and serve as a translator for PTA needs.
	Campus, Community, and Parent Involvement	Plan service projects, activities, or programs that promote citizenship and character among students and encourages community involvement. 	Environmental	Plan and coordinate activities that encourage and promote awareness of preserving the environment, participate in the Texas PTA Beautification Award Program, EPA/ Texas PTA Poster Contest, and coordinate all campus recycling programs.
