HEALTHY ALTERNATIVES

Welcome back to school Beaver families. My name is Christina Craig and I am your Health and Safety Legislation representative. For those families new to Beaver, I am an Oncology nurse at Baylor Hospital's Sammons Cancer Center in Dallas. I have a daughter entering 1st grade here at Beaver and a new baby at home.

The rate of obesity in our children is rising at an alarming rate. As many of you have probably already heard, Michelle Obama has inspired a “Let's Move” campaign. With that, many cafeterias have implemented changes in food that is served to its students. Starting in July this year, the U.S. Department of Agriculture has issued new rules that pretty much ban schools from offering students the chance to buy any type of junk food at all — even in the vending machines that are on campus but operated by independent companies.

Vending machines are only allowed to sell fruit, dairy products, whole-grain foods, lean-protein products or vegetable items that are less than 200 calories for “snacks” and 350 calories for entrees. Along with this, clubs will no longer be able to have bake sales in order to raise money, as bake sales do fall under this new regulation.

The hope is that by schools providing healthier choices, children will be healthier.

There are ways that families can do things at home to help their children make better choices. Have your children go shopping with you- allow them to pick out a new fruit or vegetable that you haven't had before. When you get home, research the fruit or vegetable and plan a recipe together. Studies show kids will try food more often when they are able to help plan and prepare the food. Make it a challenge to have your kids eat 5-8 fruits and vegetables a day. Reward them with something other than sweets or food. Encourage kids to get out every day and exercise. Make it a family event. Don't use words like diet- talk to your children about making healthy choices and show them how you make healthy choices also. Lead by example.

RESTORATION: A TWO BILLION HECTARE OPPORTUNITY

Every minute of every day for the past 13 years, the world has lost an area of forest the size of 50 soccer fields.

The greatest tragedy is that much of the deforested land now has little value, economic or ecological. The World Resources Institute has mapped two billion hectares (one hectare contains about 2.47 acres) of such degraded land -- equivalent to twice the size of China. The good news is that much of it can be turned from wasted, unused land into forests, agricultural fields, and other productive uses.



Some countries are beginning to seize this opportunity. The Bonn Challenge, a global commitment for restoration established in 2011, calls for 150 million hectares of land to be restored by 2020. Restoring this amount of land could bring \$84 billion in economic benefits annually and close the greenhouse gas "emissions gap" by one-fifth.

Brazil, Costa Rica, El Salvador, Rwanda and the United States have already made commitments to the Bonn Challenge, pledging to restore a collective 20 million hectares. This year could be a year of increased momentum.

At this time of the year many of the products feature double or bonus Box Tops. Keep your eyes open for them.




